Andi was first diagnosed with Hodgkin's lymphoma in 2006 after a 17cm tumour was discovered in his chest. Over the past three years, he has undergone 16 bouts of chemotherapy, two of intensive chemotherapy and 44 of radiotherapy. He has had a bone marrow transplant which failed, experimental chemotherapy and a stem cell transplant.
